What do Veterinary Assistants do?

Veterinary assistants support veterinarians and other animal hospital staff with essential animal care, facility upkeep and administrative duties. This can include feeding, cleaning and restraining animals, preparing surgical areas, including sterilizing equipment, scheduling and interacting with clients, and performing other tasks to keep the clinic operating smoothly.

Where do Veterinary Assistants work?

Veterinary assistants work in a variety of animal care settings, including animal hospitals and clinics, animal shelters, research labs and even zoos.

Do Veterinary Assistants work with animals?

Yes, almost all veterinary assistant work with animals daily.
